MODERN TREATMENT OF GONORRHOEA AND ITS COMPLICATIONS IN THE MALE

(By NIROD R. GUPTA, L.R.C.P. & S. (Edin.), L.R.F.P. & S. (Glas.).)

"I have found the following course of treatment most satisfactory. It is the safest and shortest anti-gonorrhoeal treatment yet discovered. As the patient comes in, start him at once with one course of uleron (Bayer), 24 pills. Then rest for seven days, and then give him a second course of uleron. By this time the pus has in most cases disappeared. All along during the uleron course irrigate the patient with 1/10,000 acriflavine solution, and instil with 1/2,000 colloidal silver solution daily; and after the second course of uleron follow up the treatment with 'gono-yatren' ('Behring') one dose to be injected every fourth day, beginning

with 50 million gonococcus, reaching up to 600 million gonococcus by the eighth dose. From the end of the first month start on the prostatic, vesicular and anterior urethral massage and continue it for one month. By this method, if strictly followed gonorrhoea can easily be cured in two months. We have never had a single complication or toxicity in a series of fifty cases. We had 95 per cent of success, of which 5 per cent had recurrence."

Four questions only to be answered

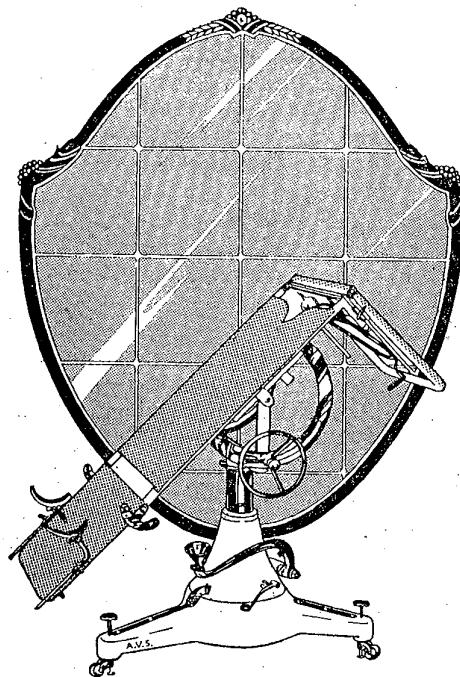
1. In the past there has been some controversy as to whether a Health Visitor should be a general trained nurse or not.
Give your views on the subject and say what you think should be the policy for the future.
2. The Public Health Commissioner wrote in his report:—
"The Health Visitor is the most important single unit in the Maternity and Child Welfare Services. On her personality, knowledge and skill, the success or failure of Child Welfare lies and her training is therefore of the utmost importance."
Discuss this.
3. "Great care must be taken lest welfare work which is primarily preventive in nature, develops a curative character".
Why is this care so necessary in India and how is the danger indicated to be avoided?
4. Describe *briefly* the work of a health visitor in a model centre, (i.e. a centre as you think it ought to be run).
Draw up a time table for a health visitor's day's work.
5. What should a health visitor do in the following circumstances:—
 - (a) A case of smallpox is found during home visiting.
 - (b) The people living next door to the Welfare Centre allow their compound to be very dirty, leave refuse about and have no proper sanitation. They resent the advice of the health visitor regarding cleanliness.
 - (c) A child with gonococcal conjunctivitis is brought to the Welfare Centre.
 - (d) Two cases of puerperal sepsis are found to have occurred in women delivered by a trained midwife practising privately.

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
